NASHVILLE ARTISTS NEDSKI & MOJO TO ENTERTAIN IN FAYETTEVILLE JANUARY 21, 2012



Nedski & Mojo? You got it—Two fine musicians (Ned Luberecki and Stephen Mougín) have joined forces as an incredible duo with strong and precise, wonderfully blended, and soulful vocals to perform at the historic Sarrazin Building on 107-E N. Washington Street in Fayetteville, Texas on Saturday, January 21, 2012. The duet of Banjo-Guitar and Mandolin-Guitar is performed with original compositions full of adventure and playfulness—a real treat for any audience.

Ned Luberecki is already known for his work in the ensembles of Chris Jones & The Night Drivers and Sirius XM Bluegrass DJ. Stephen Mougín talents are attributed as guitarist and vocalist with the Sam Bush Band.

Workshops will be conducted from 2-4 pm Saturday, January 21, prior to the House concert with Ned's two-hour banjo workshop a nominal fee of \$50.00 and Stephen's two-hour vocal harmony workshop at \$50.00. Heated jamming rooms will be provided from 4-7 pm and the concert commences at 7:30 pm. The house concert is a \$15.00 donation with limited seating.

“When not on the road with their regular gigs, you can find Nedski and Mojo performing a variety of original songs and instrumentals, along with a few classics from the worlds of Bluegrass, Newgrass, Blues and even a funny song or two,” states Dorothy Stall, promoter for this particular event. Stall continues, “Even Jason Burleson of Blue Highways refers to them as “Musical Magic.”
